English language learners work towards internationally recognised qualifications, including Cambridge University Language Assessment Examinations (e.g., IELTS in Year 12/13) and IGCSE in Year 10/11 in English as a Second Language. Our Boarding House

Our Queen Elizabeth II (QEII) Boarding House was opened in 1989 by our late Patron, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. QEII provides a home-from-home for the boys and girls that board with us. It comprises single and double study bedroom. Each boarder has their own furnished area, including a bed, wardrobe, drawers and a desk. In addition, there are comfortable spaces where pupils can relax and socialise together. Kitchenette facilities (complete with a kettle, toaster, fridge, etc.) are available to make evening snacks, with staff on hand to supervise where necessary. There is also a fully equipped gym onsite, tennis/basketball courts, and a full-size sports hall.

The boys are located on the ground floor, whilst the girls are on the top floor of the boarding house.









Location, Location

Our Senior School & Boarding House are located on a 26-acre site in Haslemere's historic, charming market town. The school is surrounded by some of South East England's most beautiful countryside, much of which is owned by the National Trust. Located halfway between London and the South Coast, we can ensure pupils visit nearby historical and cultural attractions as part of their stay with us.

Nestled between wooded hills in the southwest corner of Surrey and surrounded by National Trust land, Haslemere is one of the gems of the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and gateway town to the South Downs National Park. The town makes a great base for exploring the miles of beautiful rolling countryside, heathland, valleys, attractive market towns and picturesque villages. The rich and diverse landscape has helped to inspire many great artists and authors. Both visitors and residents are spoilt for choice, as the Haslemere area provides the perfect countryside for all leisure and sporting activities.







Local Attractions

Haslemere is the gateway to the Surrey Hills & South Downs National Park. There are plenty of attractions in the surrounding area. Just 15 minutes walk from the school is the renowned Devil's Punchbowl, a large hollow of dry sandy heath. The Punchbowl has a long history and tradition. Legend has it that the devil spent his time tormenting the god Thor by pelting him with enormous handfuls of earth, leaving the great bowl that visitors can see today. In reality the large depression was created by erosion as water percolated down and hit an impervious layer of clay. A large number of small springs sprung up across the area as the water pressure built up. The hollow is overlooked by the 894 feet Gibbet Hill, the second highest hill in Surrey.

Just 10 minutes away from the school is Haslemere station, with direct trains straight to London Waterloo.

The Royal School is ideal for parents wanting a wholesome, safe environment for pupils that is close enough to London to experience the culture and magnificence of our capital.









Weekend Activities & Adventures

Whatever the weather, we offer a range of exciting social, cultural and sports activities, encouraging everyone to join in and try something new. International students will benefit from a full British experience whilst at The Royal.

The full programme of activities encourages pupils to develop their personality and talents, supporting and celebrating each other's achievements and helping them discover new interests and hobbies.

No 'compulsory' exeat weekends

At The Royal, we take the cost and worry of going to guardians for exeats out of the picture. We remain open and buzzing with activities throughout the term. This is a unique offering and is popular with parents and pupils alike. Royal pupils have the choice to stay with us over the weekends (except holidays and half terms) to enjoy a range of activities lead by our experienced Head of Boarding.
