One -Year GCSE Course











Course Overview

Our one-year course for Year 11 pupils has been designed to allow international pupils to sit GCSEs but is offered in one academic year instead of the standard two-year course UK pupils follow.

The course is suitable for pupils aged 15 and 16 who may have transferred to the UK at the end of Year 10 (or equivalent) and therefore need to complete their GCSE studies in one year.

The course is also suitable for those international pupils who wish to study A levels and/or BTECs but who first need an introduction to the British curriculum.

Benefits:

- Provides the foundation and accreditations to British and international pupils wanting to further their studies in the UK.
- Pupils are equipped with the skills to learn to work independently, think critically and logically, and express ideas with confidence.
- Accelerated EAL (English as an Additional Language) Programme



Over the course of one year, learners study up to six GCSEs, depending on ability.

The programme includes:

- Pupils join Year 11 in September
- Are part of the Year 11 form group
- GCSEs in up to six subjects: maths, English as an Additional Language (EAL), native language (if offered), further maths (for the most able mathematicians), a science, and either geography or statistics.
- Games
- Future Ready lessons during form time
- EAL lessons with highly experienced specialist teachers
- British Culture Programme
- PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education)/RSE (Relationships & Sex Education)

All pupils join the House system and enriching assembly programme, which are designed to give pupils a group identity and an opportunity to participate in various activities, including music, drama, fundraising for local and national/international charities, debating and sporting events.
